# Earth Day activities at New Mt. Ida Cemetery

On Saturday April 21 volunteers from Willard Camp participated in Earth Day activities at New Mt. Ida Cemetery in Troy, NY. Organized locally by Lorraine English, the day was planned as part of a neighborhood "clean up." Through the efforts of Graves Officer Brother John Hilton our camp joined forces with the neighborhood folks, faithful volunteers Alysia Hamilton and Cameron Smith, and a fraternity from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute to tidy up the Cemetery. It gave us an opportunity to re-emplace the gravestones of Shuabel Bingham and Almira Parsells - - the great grandparents of Patriotic Instructor Brother Arthur Young. We also helped reset three other large stones. Two stones required a tripod and chain hoist ("comealong") in order to be properly lifted and set. The morning and early afternoon was also spent cleaning, raking and cutting down young black locust trees growing too closely to, and upending, many headstones. This was a very successful volunteer effort!

### **Brother at Fort Fisher Event:**



Brother Gary Salmon, a member of the Willard Camp, now living in North Carolina attended the 147th anniversary of the battle of Fort Fisher, NC.

Near the end of the Civil War one of the last Southern ports still open to foreign trade was Wilmington, NC. It was protected by a very strong fortification called Fort Fisher. The fort was the scene of two battles. The first battle started on December 24, 1864 and ended with a Union withdrawal on the 28th; and the second began on January 12, 1865 and ended on the 15th when the Confederates surrendered. Wilmington, NC was then taken on February 22nd. These battles included both an Army and a large Naval landing force as well as support from 56 naval ships. Eight hundred and fifty-five men on both sides lost their lives during the two battles. Fifty-one Union soldiers, sailors and marines earned the Medal of Honor for their actions at the second battle of Fort Fisher. This past January marked the 147th anniversary of the second battle and Camp Brother Gary Salmon participated in the commemoration.

# **New Monitor Poster Now in Print:**

Our original USS Monitor poster that was funded through a grant by the Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area in 2010 has been updated and reprinted. The new poster includes much new scholarship including "in brief" information about the design of the lower hull, the oak frame used for the upper hull and the roots of the concept of a low freeboard ironclad battery with a rotating turret. In addition, Mr. Steve Muller, author of Troy, New York and the Building of the USS Monitor, kindly provided updated information about the sources of the deck plates, angle iron, rivets and bulkheads from his recent research conducted in the New York State Archives. Research for the updating was also done by Brother Keough and Commander Dziewulski along with contributions from Mr. Chuck Veit and Michael M. Dziewulski of the US Naval Landing Party. The reprinting of the poster was made possible through funds from the Massachusetts Foundation for the Humanities (MFA) and printing was done locally at Alchar Printers of Troy, NY.
