2015 Memorial Day, a Week to Remember

As part of the Memorial Day events at Oakwood Cemetery, the Colonel George L. Willard Camp 154, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War dedicated the new signs directing visitors to the General Thomas gravesite on the Kellogg Family plot. The dedication took place immediately after the annual Wreath Laying Ceremony at Veterans' Circle by the Friends of Oakwood Cemetery and the Véterans of Lansingburgh.

At the Thomas gravesite Mr. Michael Barrett, Director of the Hudson Mohawk Industrial Gateway, presented introductory comments on the life and career of Gen. Thomas. Camp Commander Leo McGuire offered the opening to original Order #11 describing Decoration Day. Department Commander Ray LeMay III added remarks recognizing the Willard Camp's work as well as the Department of NY's history of in-

volvement with the project.
Finally project liaison, Brother Dziewulski, made dedicatory comments that included a brief reiteration of the relationship between the Oakwood Cemetery and the SUVCW. Initially the Department of New York adopted the gravesite. However, work began in earnest when Willard Camp also was able to adopt the site with the support of Department Order #6,by then Commander Albanese (2012), and the completion of a Memorandum of Understanding among the Cemetery, Friends of Oakwood Cemetery and Willard Camp in 2013. Attendees were escorted by the U.S. Marine veterans of the Leathernecks Motorcycle Club and the 125th NY Volunteer Infantry reenacting group closed the ceremony with a musket firing salute.

This dedication was supposed to have occurred in the September 2014, shortly after the emplacement of the signs, but a busy Fall and horrible Winter prevented the ceremony from occurring. With a little patience and careful planning, much like "Ol' Slow Trot" himself - - a nickname for Thomas because of his extensive preparation and deliberate actions - - we finally came to the point of completion for this project.

With the permission of Oakwood Cemetery, Willard Camp also announced that the next project for the gravesite will be the assessment of the beech tree that has threatened the grave markers of the Kellogg plot, the Thomas monument and the cast iron fence surrounding the plot. It is likely that the tree will be removed. Details will be forthcoming about fund-raising

On the traditional Memorial Day, May 30th members of the Camp gathered at Albany Rural Cemetery and conducted services at the GAR plot. From there they moved to Oakwood

and conducted services at the Soldier and Sailor plot, the Thomas, Willard and Geer graves. The last stop was the Cohoes GAR monument to form a Color Guard. (see story on page 4)

Cohoes Project Becomes a Reality

The Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) monument in West End Park Cohoes is to become the center piece of a new veterans' park. After years of planning the details were made public on May 30, 2015, "Decoration Day," with a gathering of citizens, politicians, veterans and the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War on hand. The original GAR monument which was dedicated in 1910 is located on a former city cemetery. It will be combined with walkways, benches, plantings, flag poles, markers and two Civil War era mortars to become a memorial to all those from the City of Cohoes that have served their country. On hand were U.S. Rep. Paul Tonko, Cohoes Mayor George Primeau Sr. and Randy Koniowka, deputy clerk of the Albany County Legislature. The project is expected to cost \$100,000.00.
