

Strange Discovery

On May 30, 2019 the Brothers of the Col. George L. Willard Camp 154 SUVCW gathered at the GAR monument in Albany Rural Cemetery as we have for many years. The stones and lawn were well groomed for the event. After the ceremony a woman who had observed the event came over and told us about another GAR plot in the cemetery that no one in the Camp knew about. Paula Lemire, who works with Albany Rural Cemetery, explained to us that we held our annual remembrance at the GAR monument located at the "soldiers' and sailors' " plot and not the GAR plot. Ms. Lemire indicated that the GAR plot was in another part of the cemetery. After investigating we found that plot 100A was the real GAR plot that contained 37 graves. When first visited, the area was over grown with grass almost to the top of the headstones. Brother James King organized a work party with members of the 125th NY Regimental Association to make a first attempt at cleaning up the plot and creating a record of who is buried there. This took place on June 12th. After the Camp completes the projects at the General Thomas and Col. Willard gravesites we will begin a project to ensure that those buried in the GAR plot will not be forgotten and the area appropriately improved.

All In Preparation

Seth Pierce never had a marker to denote his life or his service in the Union Army during the Civil War. In fact people were not sure where exactly he was buried. After some intense research, delving into local history and a little luck Brian Castler, Willard Camp Commander, solved the mystery. Seth lived in Newcomb, NY, died in Utica but was buried in Blue Mountain Lake, NY. A marker was ordered and shipped to Long Lake.

On July 27th Long-Laker Jim Croon, Brother Robert Keough and the Camp Commander got together at Blue Mountain Lake Cemetery in Blue Mountain Lake. The marker was emplaced, leveled and then cemented into place.

All this is in preparation for a future dedication of the marker by the SUVCW. All of the research on Seth was undertaken by Brian Castler both as a member of the SUVCW and in his role as the Town of Long Lake Archivist.
