
Many events to catch up on from 2022

There was a good turn out of media and approximately 100 people were in attendance. All of the Plum family monuments were cleaned for the event and the metal crosses stolen from one of the Plum monuments were replaced.

- On October 5 the Camp was part of several groups in attendance celebrating President Chester Arthur's birthday at his grave site.
- Officers for 2023 were sworn in on during the December Camp meeting.
- Wreaths Across America was celebrated (Dec. 17) by placing wreaths at the GAR plot in Albany Rural Cemetery and at the General Thomas, Col. Willard and Veterans Lot in Oakwood Cemetery.
- At the January 2023 Camp meeting it was announced that Cameron Smith and the G. L. Willard Camp 154 were awarded at \$70,800 American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) grant (see story p.3).
- Commander Maggs made final appointments to various officer positions for the calendar year 2023.

GAR Plot Rededicated



The GAR plot located in Albany Rural Cemetery was rededicated on Veterans Day 2022. First and foremost, the ceremony recognized those veterans buried in the plot. The Camp also dedicated the flagpole and solar light that was donated by Trustco Bank. A roadside sign that indicates the year the plot was established was also noted during the ceremony. The sign, although a project of the Camp, was anonymously donated. We are very grateful to our benefactors for helping us "keep green the memory" of our relatives who served to preserve the Union.

ARPA Grant Awarded

In 2022 the City of Troy announced the availability of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds in the Spring with proposals due in May. Cameron Smith, with crucial support from the George L. Willard Camp 154 Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War and Joseph Ferrannini of Grave Stone Matters, defined a project, "Preserving The Mount Ida Cemeteries." This project was for both the Old and New Mount Ida Cemeteries and it aligned with the City's emphasis on improving public greenspaces that are in need of deferred maintenance and were essential resources during the pandemic. In early November the team was excited to learn that the proposal was approved for funding by the City Council after being recommended by the City's ARPA Steering Committee.

The project objectives focus on preserving the Old and New Mount Ida cemeteries through a one-time investment in a tree survey and maintenance program along with monument repair and preservation. Trees will be trimmed to remove dead, dying and crowded limbs which will allow new healthy growth. Under the trees are marble and granite monuments, many of which are Civil War Veterans and significant figures from Troy's past, that will be cleaned and repaired. Ultimately, the project will help ensure the greenspace remains safe for visitors and honors those interred there. The effort will bring the Cemeteries closer to their original conditions.

PlanIT Geo completed the New Mount Ida tree survey in late April. That work will guide the tree maintenance work to be performed later this year. On Monday May 22nd Mr. Ferrannini began a working session in Old Mount Ida on Pawling Ave. that lasted until June 10th. Many fallen or buried monuments have been extracted from the dirt and are being cleaned, repaired, and up righted; some were nearly 200 years old.
