# Plaque Dedication at Congress Park in Saratoga Springs

On October 5th, the City of Saratoga Springs officially recognized the many contributions made for the restoration of the 77th New York Volunteer Infantry statue situated in Congress Park. Shortly after the statue was vandalized on the early morning of July 17, 2020, Willard Camp started a Go Fund Me account to help with restoration.

Many concerned and generous members of the public contributed to the fund. In addition, The New York Civil War Sesquicentennial Committee donated the remaining funds in their account to assist in the effort. Contributions helped with both restoration of the monument and a security system that included updated cameras and monitoring.

# On-Going Work at Mt. Ida Cemetery

As reported in the last edition of the *Guidon*, the first phase of the ARPA-funded Mt. Ida Cemetery Project was completed on June 10, 2023 in the "old" portion of the cemetery. Work was resumed by Joe Ferrannini and Cameron Smith on October 1 and continued, with some interruptions due to weather, until October 17. Afterwards, Cameron completed filling repairs with Lithomex (special lime-based patch) to finish this phase of work. A total of 41 monuments were restored.

In early November, multiple arborist work crews spent two days in both Old and New Mt. Ida trimming trees. Many limbs and dead wood were removed from a number of trees without damage to any of the monuments. This trimming work completed the remainder of the Fall 2023 efforts that were planned.

#### Recovery of Veteran's Headstone



During the recent work done in Old Mt. Ida Cemetery, a stone for (Jacob) Quincy Wood was recovered and reset. He served in Company I, 125th NY Volunteer Regiment. His grave was located immediately behind the small service building that faces Pawling Avenue. We are all grateful that this Civil War veteran can again be properly remembered.

#### A Civil War Christmas (Carol)

It may be difficult to believe that much of how many celebrate Christmas today has roots in the Civil War. Early in the 19th century, the holiday was not widely celebrated. For example, in Boston businesses were open and churches were closed! But the mid-century conflict solidified traditions and popularized much of the familiar music. Even Thomas Nast's now popular drawings of Santa found in Harper's Weekly had their roots in the political propaganda of the day.

It would not be difficult to put together a program of Civil War Christmas carols. Silent Night, which originated in Germany in 1818, was introduced to the US in a translation by an Episcopal priest in New York City in 1859. Examples of other carols and their dates of origin, before or during the Civil War, include:

- ❖ O Holy Night 1847
- ❖ It Came Upon a Midnight Clear 1849
- The One Horse Open Sleigh (Jingle Bells) -1857.
- ❖ We Three Kings of Orient Are 1863.
- Up on the Housetop 1864.
